



A multi-purpose plate of Tokyo fine-pattern dyeing silk fabric, or simply Edo Komon, sealed in acrylic resin. Comes in various sizes and is suitable for serving sweets or containing jewelry. Edo Komon was created 600 years ago and became widely popular for formal kimono in 17th century. The stencils are carved by highly skilled craftsmen, and the technique is designated as a specified traditional craft of Japan. Sand blasted where depressed. Hand wash.
